

Note on Covid-19

As we are sure you are aware, we are experiencing a time of deep global uncertainty. Many are unwell and many will become unwell. Through all this, Mission Africa continues to strive in its goal of bringing the Good News of Jesus to the people of Africa, reaching the unreached, loving the unloved and discipling new believers. We would greatly value your prayers in the weeks and months ahead as we assess how best to share the Gospel with those in need.

Staying safe

Following updated advice from the UK government, Mission Africa is suspending its meetings and events with immediate effect. We have postponed our Scottish and Belfast conferences in anticipation of holding something later in the year. We are asking our Belfast based staff to work from home where possible. The office will remain operational in all of its functions but will not be manned continuously. Whilst we normally warmly welcome visitors, we ask that you do not visit the office until further notice and communicate with us by email and telephone.

Echoing the recommendations of Presbyterian, Methodist and Church of Ireland denominations, we are recommending that our prayer groups do not meet in person, in order to help prevent the spread of COVID-19. As a practical expression of loving our neighbour, we all

must do all in our power to limit the transmission of this disease.

With a number of nations temporarily closing their borders and with the current UK Government advice to avoid overseas travel, with heavy hearts we have made the decision to suspend our short term programmes for the foreseeable future. The safety and well-being of our team members and short-termers is of highest concern to Mission Africa. We are working with travel partners to rearrange flights for anyone currently in the field and to cancel any existing bookings. We have already contacted anyone due to travel in the next few months.

Praying faithfully

We encourage all our supporters to explore alternate methods of prayer and fellowship such as setting up a telephone or SMS prayer chain or WhatsApp group. Prayer remains vital at this challenging time, so we urge you to find ways to continue upholding Mission Africa before the Lord.

Finally let us take comfort in knowing that we follow a God who loves us and cares for us, who has promised to go with us wherever we go. Take comfort in knowing that the very name of Jesus means God saves. In these troubling times, let us make an effort to be a light in the darkness, let us become known for our bold, compassionate desire to show the love of Jesus to those around us.

Pray with Jeremy for those studying God's word through explorers clubs, that many will come to faith. Interruptions continue through terrorists related school closures and now also COVID-19, may wisdom be granted in using the opportunities still available.

23rd April

Pray for those working on the front line to deal with the coronavirus crisis all around the world, and particularly in Africa. Pray for wisdom and global partnership. Pray against tribalism and nationalism, but for a uniting of humanity.

24th April

Pray for nations with underdeveloped healthcare systems that they won't be overwhelmed by the influx of COVID-19 cases and that other vital services such as HIV/AIDS care, malaria treatment and accident and emergency facilities will be able to continue.

25th April

Pray that the poor and vulnerable will be able to get and afford treatment when needed. Pray that those who lose their income will not go hungry.

26th April
